Open College offers college credit through independent study. It makes college level courses available to persons who wish to earn credits with a minimum of campus visits. Learning resources such as videocassettes, audiocassettes and computers are available at most of the campuses to assist students. Students may interact with faculty via telephone, appointments, and organized review sessions. Tests are given at North, Kendall and Wolfson Campuses. Open College courses are accredited and recorded on student transcripts as all other Miami Dade credit courses.
